First Child Congress in Lalitpur Metropolitan city

Lalitpur Metropolitan City (LMC) Ward 22 successfully organized the 1st Child Congress in collaboration with World Vision International Nepal and Child Development Society. The Ward Chairperson and ward members chaired the program, where 42 children from all schools in Bungmati had participated. Children between the ages of 6 and 18 actively participated in the event.

During the Child Congress, children engaged in group activities to discuss changes observed before and after previous congresses. They addressed safety,

vulnerability, likes and dislikes, and raised concerns about violence, abuse, discrimination, neglect, exploitation, and school services. These discussions aimed to shed light on the challenges faced by children within the municipality.

Ratna Bhakta Maharjan, a member of Ward 22, stressed the importance of including children's voices in developing realistic plans for their rights and protection. Incorporating genuine perspectives from children would enable the ward to design more effective strategies, considering different stages of child development.

At the end of the program, the Ward Level Child Club presented a prioritized list of 32 plans developed by the children to the Ward Chairperson. This marked the transfer of children's aspirations and ideas to the decision-makers, who will translate them into actionable steps for the fiscal year 2080/81. The Child Congress empowered children to voice their concerns, contribute to decision-making, and shape the future of their community.

In order to promote child-friendly local governance within the municipality, CDS in Collaboration Chandragiri with Municipality organized а two-days orientation session. The Mayor of the Municipality presided over the program, which was attended by Ward chairperson, Department head of Social Development Section and other. The orientation aimed to train 60 enumerators who were chosen by the Municipality. All the enumerators selected were residents of Chandragiri, which will make the data collection easier within their own municipality

The First day of the program was mainly focused on conceptual knowledge on child rights and child protection, and familiarized the enumerators with the Kobo data collection platform, where the second day was totally focused on the data entry method. During the orientation, all enumerators were trained and assigned specific locations for conducting the survey.

Workshop on Provincial level Draft Policy Editing

29th May 2023, On 27th the Social Development Ministry of Bagmati Provincial government, in collaboration with Child development Society (CDS) and World Vision International (WVI Nepal), organized final refining workshop with provincial CRC team on draft finalization of provincial level children policy of Bagmati Province at Nagarkot. The a productive interactive program provided platform for stakeholders to engage in a discussion on improving the lives of children in the province. The feedback generated during the program is expected to be incorporated into the final policy document, ensuring that it comprehensively addresses the key issues faced

Refresher training on CFLG to the Municipal level CFLG committee

Kirtipur Municipality, in coordination with Child Development Society (CDS), has organized a two-day orientation on Child Friendly Local Government (CFLG) in Dhulikhel. The program takes place on 2nd and 3rd June 2023, with the participation of elected representatives and officials from the municipality.

The objective of the orientation is to share the representatives' initiatives in the field of CFLG and to enhance their knowledge and capacity to support the declaration of Kirtipur Municipality as a Child Friendly Local Government. Kirtipur Municipality ward no. 7 is in the process of declaration for Child Friendly Local Governance with the coordination of Child Development Society and World Vision International Nepal. Since then, Kirtipur Municipality municipal level Child Friendly Local Governance committee has been directly working on CFLG.

Through the training, Municipal officials and members are capacitated on the process of CFLG declaration and child well-being. After taking the orientation D-Mayor of Kirtipur has committed to contribute in declaration of the municipality in her tenure ship.
